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

Executive Summary

Community Medicine is the branch of medicine concerned with the health of populations rather than individuals. Department of Community Medicine, MGMCRI is trying hard to promote health and cater to the Primary health care needs of the community.

The department is always trying to collaborate in initiatives by Government of India, Government of Puducherry, various National and International Health Agency including World Health Organization and other institutions/NGOs on different occasions to serve the community people at large.

During COVID19 pandemic, the department has been involved into various prevention and control activities as per the need and expectations. As per the instructions from the Deputy Director Public Health cum State Surveillance Officer, IDSP, Puducherry, a surveillance team has been deployed at Kanni Kovil Check post. The aim was to screen national and International passengers for symptoms of COVID19. The department faculties, MSWs, Health educator and posgraduates recorded audio IEC messages on COVID19 and periodic dissemination was done in 4 areas covering around 30,000 population (Kariklampakkam, Thavalakuppam and Abishekapakkam, Ariyankuppam) allotted to MGMCRI by Ministry of Health and Family welfare, Puducherry. The Government of Puducherry allotted five Primary Health Centres (PHCs) viz. Bahour, Kirumampakkam, Karayamputhur, Murugampakkam, Odeinsalai to MGMCRI for door to door survey by using epicollect5 mobile app. The department has involved 88 PGs from different departments, 85 Nursing

staff and 170 CRRIs along with the staff members of Department of Community Medicine. The team was able to screen 80,000 individuals in these areas over a span of 45 days.

PGs of the department were posted with Department of Public Health and Preventive Medicine, Cuddalore, Tamilnadu for COVID19 contact tracing activities. Health awareness program at Mettupalayam industrial area and tele consultation for COVID19 related queries in five districts were among few other activities for COVID19.

On behalf of the department, I thank all higher officials (Administration and Management) of MGMCRI, SBVU for their support and constant encouragement during COVID19 related activities.



Summary of COVID19 activities

Active screening

- Massive house to house screening covering a population of 1,50,000 people under 5 PHCs in Puducherry
- Screening for travel history and flu like symptoms
- Non Communicable Disease and Antenatal care profile

Audio IEC

- Audio messages about COVID-19 and its prevention in four villages of Puducherry- Ariyankuppam, Thavalakuppam, Abishegapakkam and Karikalampakkam
- IEC activity for 5 days covering a population of around 30,000

Toll screening

- Continuous screening of all passengers travelling through road from the adjoining state (TN) at tollgate (Point of entry) from March 14, 2020
- Screening for travel history and flu like symptoms
- About 200- 500 vehicles screened per day

Control room

- Part of Emergency Operating Control room under IDSP in Cuddalore District for COVID-19 surveillance and contact tracing
- Contact tracing for the patients who tests positive for COVID-19 in Cuddalore district.
- Screening all the passengers from abroad in Cuddalore via phone calls twice a day for symptoms of COVID-19

Industrial visit

- Health awareness on prevention and control of COVID19 at Mettupalayam Industrial estate
- Distrubtion of SOPs for functioning of Micro, small and medium scale industries

Tele consultation

- Awareness programme on COVID19 awareness and child health through phone
- Teleconsultaion of COVID19 queries from 5 districts

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Border booth surveillance – at the point of entry (Kanniyakovil check post) (From March 12, 2020 to till date)

As per the instructions from the Deputy Director Public Health cum State Surveillance Officer, IDSP, Puducherry, a surveillance team has been deployed under the effective guidance of Dr. Swathi Pawar (DMS) and Dr. Lokesh (HOD, Department of General Medicine), Dr. Abhijit V Boratne (HOD, Department of Community Medicine) and Mrs. Kripa Angeline (Nursing Superintendent) for the border booth surveillance for screening all the passengers entering via road. Medical team comprising of postgraduates along with interns, Medical Social Workers (MSW) and Nursing Staff (NS) were posted at the point of entry from where the passengers from the adjacent districts/states enters Puducherry. Medical team screens the passengers for symptoms of COVID 19. International passengers were line listed and the passengers whoever had symptoms of COVID 19 were referred to the COVID 19 hospital (IGMC&RI).



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






Distribution of awareness pamphlets by our PostGraduate

- All the passengers who had travel history were kept under home quarantine and the same details were reported to the state Government through web portal (https://stopcorona.tn.gov.in).
- Throat swabs were taken from all the patients who were admitted and isolated in GH with SARI.
- Measures to provide 3 meals per day for all the patients for the entire 14 days of quarantine.
- Contact tracing for the patients who tests positive for COVID-19.
- Tracking all the passengers via phone calls twice a day for symptoms of COVID-19 and updating the same information to state via http://stopcorona.tn.gov.in
- Looking/asking for symptoms of COVID-19 to the passengers at the screening point in Airport through video calls.
- District Co-ordination meeting to set up protocols and operational guidelines.
- District level containment plans and strategies

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Daily reporting was done from Dept of Community Medicine (via Nodal Officer of MGMCRI) to the Director of Health and IDSP. Google sheets have been filled for the line listed passengers and sent to the govt as well.

From March 25th, after implementation of section 144, no vehicles were allowed without the exempted vehicles. After screening the passengers, we advised them report to the nearest health facility or contact the toll-free helpline number in case they develop any respiratory symptoms/ fever within this period. Details of vehicles whichever had entered for medical purposes were also noted down and the google sheets were filled accordingly.

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Surveillance at Emergency Operating Control (EOC) Room with Rapid Response team at District Collectorate, Cuddalore (24.03.2020 to 30.04.2020)

Post Graduates from the Department of Community Medicine, MGMC&RI, were posted in Deputy Director of Health Services (DDHS) office, Cuddalore as a part of our external visits in various public health institutes as per MCI recommendations for MD curriculum.

Dr.Geetha MBBS., DPH, Deputy Director of Public Health, Cuddalore had appointed the Post graduates to be a part of the surveillance activities carried out at the district level (from 24.03.2020).

The surveillance activities were as follows:


Surveillance activities:

- Emergency Operating System (EOS) was formed under IDSP.

 The constituent members of the team are:
 - 1. District collector Mr. Anbuselvan IAS, along with 4 sub-collectors
 - 2. Deputy Director of Health services (DDHS) Dr.Geetha
 - 3. Second level officers Dr.Gautham (APM NHM), Dr.Lavanya (DPM NCD), Dr. Manokaran (Epidemiologist), Dr.Seethakumari (DTT-M0)
 - 4. Public health officials under JDHS (District hospital Cuddalore)
 - 5. MHO
 - 6. Post graduates from Department of Community Medicine, MGMCRI
 - 7. CRRIs posted in Cuddalore GH
- Epidemiologist, Data entry manager (District level) has gathered all the block level Data Entry Operators (DEO) at the Emergency Operating Control Room (EOCR) which has been set up at the District Collectorate office, Cuddalore.
- The list of passengers (belonging to Cuddalore district) who have arrived from other countries were received from Airport Authority, Chennai (MAA airport). The list of passengers was divided as per the block level and the same information was sent to the BMO. BMO along with HI had visited all the passengers in person to ask/look for symptoms of SARI (Severe Acute Respiratory tract Infection) and COVID-19 infection twice a day. Instructions had been given to the health care providers to carry PPEs when they go for field visit.

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<u>Audio Information Education Communication (IEC) Activity for COVID-19</u> (01.04.2020 to 11.04.2020)

In view of the Covid-19 pandemic, IEC activity was planned by our Department to be done in areas around our institution to increase the level of awareness and to promote preventive measures to break the transmission chain of COVID19. The Government circular regarding the same, allotted us the semi-urban and rural area of Kariklampakkam, Thavalakuppam and Abishekapakkam, Ariyankuppam to carry out IEC activity. Under the guidance of Mr. Joseph (Deputy Registrar) of the institution, Dr. Abhijit V Boratne (Prof. & HOD Dept. of Community Medicine) the logistics, fund and scheduling were worked up in the last week of March. Mr. Parthasarathy (MSW, Dept. of Community Medicine) was given the task for carrying out this IEC activity in the fieldThe awareness audio media was written by Mr. Shanmugam, (Health educator Dept. of Community Medicine) recorded by Dr.Mageshwari (1st year PG, Dept. of Community Medicine). The IEC activities were scheduled from (01.04.2020 to 11.04.2020)

We have successfully conducted the IEC activity in the allotted places on behalf of the Department of Community Medicine, MGMCRI. In the period of lockdown, the Coronavirus disease awareness was highly beneficial to the general public.

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COVID 19 Active Case Finding community survey

As per the instructions from Chief Minister, Health minister on 7.4.2020 all the private medical colleges were assigned the duty of active community surveillance activities i.e. house to house screening of individuals by doctors. Entire population of Puducherry has been divided into 6 zones, divided by Primary Health Centres (PHCs) for 6 private medical colleges.

MGMCRI was allotted with 5 PHCs (3 rural and 2 urban) for performing surveillance activities. Microplan was prepared for individual PHCs and day wise microplan was prepared to allot students for the survey. A team of 130 doctors (PGs and Interns) and 4 social workers were assigned for duty. Around 10 health workers (ANM, AWW, ASHA) per day were allotted by the PHC MO for guiding us in the field. All the individuals were screened for symptoms of COVID 19 and history of travel to other districts / states and countries were ruled out. Data was collected and uploaded using Epicollect 5 app.

Under the guidance of Department of Community medicine and coordination with Post graduates of Community Medicine, about 88 postgraduates' students/Junior residents from departments like General Surgery, Anaesthesia, Radiology, Master Health Check-up, General Medicine, Paediatrics, Pulmonary Medicine, Pathology, Ophthalmology, Dermatology, Microbiology participated in this survey. The 170 CRRIs from all departments and 85 Staff nurses actively involved in this community survey.

Details collected during the survey are as follows:

- Socio-demographic characteristics
- Contact number
- Travel history
- Presence of symptoms of COVID19
- Presence of NCD
- Presence of U5 children and AN woman in the house
- Any challenges in procuring medicine
- Any others challenges / suggestions / Complaints


Active case finding was done by house to house survey in all 5 PHCs. This data has been sent to Govt. of Puducherry and line listing of individuals whoever had symptoms of COVID 19 was done. Medical team from the PHC went back to the symptomatic patients and they have tested and treated/the patients.

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

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ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES-FIELD VISIT REPORT

Introduction

The importance of Environmental Studies cannot be disputed. The need for sustainable development is a key to the future of mankind. The degradation of our environment is linked to continuing problems of pollution, loss of forest, solid waste disposal, issues related to economic productivity and national as well as ecological security. The increasing levels of global warming, the depletion of the ozone layer and a serious loss of biodiversity have also made everyone aware of growing environmental concerns.

It is clear that no citizen of the earth can afford to be ignorant of environmental issues. Environmental management has become a part of the health care sector. Managing environmental hazards and preventing possible disasters has become an urgent need.

Destruction of habitats, over use of energy resources and environmental pollution have been found to be responsible for the loss of a large number of life forms. It is feared that a large proportion of life on earth may get wiped out in the near future.

The UGC has shown concern that enough coverage has not been given in the syllabus regarding environmental studies. In addressing this issue a field visit was organized for the Final year BDS students by the Department of Public Health Dentistry, Indira Gandhi Institute of Dental Sciences.

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
WATER TREATMENT PLANT, SIRUVANI



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Introduction Lecture

The history of water treatment plant was introduced by Mr.Devanathan, Assistant engineer of Tamil Nadu Water Supply and Drainage Board. He explained the history of this water source detection and the potable water requirements and the level of water treated in this plant. The water from Siruvani water falls were directed to this treatment plant through tunnel of 1.3kms stretch and open channel of 1.4 kms. Rapid sand filtration process is followed in this plant.











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PROCESS OF THE TREATMENT UNIT:

The main source of water received from SIRUVANI DAM is situated in

Kerala State. The raw water passed through a tunnel of size 1.80 x 2.10 m and 1.55 km long

from the source to the screening chamber. In Siruvani Water Treatment Plant, water purification

is done by MECHANICAL/ RAPID SAND FILTER METHOD.

AERATION CHAMBER: (23.4 X 16.3 m)

The raw water is aerated for 3 -5 minutes to create interface between air

and water. It removes tastes & odours, increases dissolved oxygen content of water. Due to

aeration, bacteria may be killed to some extent.

CHLORINE ROOM: (15 x 12 m)

PRECHLORINATION:

The aerated water is prechlorinated in chlorine room. The turbidity of

water is checked before prechlorination. Prechlorination oxidizes iron, magnesium & hydrogen

sulphide; kills pathogenic bacteria; destroys taste & odour producing constituents; controls algae

& slime organisms; aids in coagulation.

CHEMICAL HOUSE: (25.8 X 14.5 m)

ALUM SOLUTION PREPARATION TANK: (COAGULATION)

The aerated & prechlorinated water is first treated with chemical

coagulant, ALUM in alum solution preparation tank.

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COAGULANT DOSING:

The amount of alum added to the aerated water is calculated using a coagulant doser machine.

FLASH MIXER: (RAPID MIXING)

In Siruvani Water Treatment Plant, there are 2 Flash Mixers (FLASH MIXER I & II).

The treated water is then subjected to violent agitation in "Flash Mixer – Mixing Chamber" for few minutes. This allow a quick and thorough dissemination of alum throughout the bulk of water.

CLARIFLOCCULATOR: (FLOCCULATION & SEDIMENTATION)

In Siruvani Water Treatment Plant, there are 2 units of Clariflocculator.

- Clariflocculator Unit I Diameter 51.70 m.
- Clariflocculator Unit II Diameter 51.70 m.

Both Flocculation & Sedimentation process is done in Clariflocculator.

FLOCCULATION:

Flocculation involves slow and gentle stirring of treated water in flocculation chamber. The stirrer arm rotates slowly and completes one full rotation of Clariflocculator in 1 hour. Flocculation results in formation of flocculent precipitate of aluminium hydroxide.

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SEDIMENTATION:

The flocculated water is allowed to stagnate for few hours. The flocculent precipitate, impurities & bacteria settles down in the tank and the settled clear water overflows from Clariflocculator to the filter house for filtration.

FILTER HOUSE: (FILTRATION)

The filter house (64 x 22 m) consists of filters, air blowers, wash water tank & pump for wash water tank.

FILTERS:

- No. of beds & type: 16 twin type (2 Nos. stand by) rapid gravity.
- Size of each bed: 7.43 x 7.96 m.
- Capacity of each bed: 7.24 MLD.
- Rate of filtration: 100 LPM/M².

FILTER BED:

- First layer: 50 mm x 27 mm gravel 100 mm deep.
- Second layer: 37 mm x 12 mm gravel 100 mm deep.
- Third layer: 12 mm x 6 mm gravel 100 mm deep.
- Fourth layer: 6 mm x 3.175 mm gravel 150 mm deep.
- Fifth layer: 14/28 mesh sand 750 mm deep.

The partly purified water from Clariflocculator unit is then subjected to Rapid Sand Filtration by passing down the water through the filter bed. Filtration removes the



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remaining alum floc which is not removed by sedimentation. The filtered water is then collected in Clear Water Reservoir from outlet channels of the filter.

WASH WATER TANK: (BACK WASHING)

As filtration proceeds, the suspended impurities & bacteria clog the filters resulting in their reduced efficiency called "LOSS OF HEAD". Back washing is done by reversing the flow of water (by pumping) through the sand bed. It helps in dislodging impurities & cleaning up sand bed. Washing is stopped when wash water is sufficiently clean. Back washing takes about 15 minutes.

CLEAR WATER RESERVOIR: (Diameter - 45m)

Finally, the filtered water is then stored in clear water reservoir. Before storing, "FINAL CHLORINATION" process takes place. Clear Water Reservoir holds 45 lakhs litres of water. From Clear Water Reservoir, water is distributed to all the cities of Coimbatore for domestic purpose.

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
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
