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OVERVIEW

The systematic training program for interns is a value-added course, that engage the interns and specialize them in the basic skill set that are essential for a doctor to assess and perform them with confidence in and outside their alma mater.

CATHETERIZATION:

This patient presents to you with acute retention of urine. Catheterize this patient.

- 1. Male catheterization mannequin with simulated urine preloaded
- 2. Foley's catheter 16G
- 3. 10 cc syringe *2
- 4. Gloves (1 pair/candidate)
- 5. Simulated cleaning solution, gauze and sponge holder





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- 6. Lubricating jelly
- 7. Kidney dish
- 8. Appropriate disposal bag for biohazard waste

NG TUBE INSERTION:

This patient requires nasogastric tube feeding for dysphagia secondary to partially obstructing carcinoma oesophagus. Insert the provided nasogastric tube into the stomach of the mannequin and explain precautions to be taken to ensure safe NG feeding.

Observer check list for NG tube insertion:

1.	Takes consent and explains procedure	
2.	Uses personal protection	
3.	Lubricates tube adequately	
4.	Inserts tube gently through nose	
5.	Asks patient to swallow at correct time	
6.	Ensures correct tube placement by auscultation while injecting air/aspirating gastric content	
7.	Explains need for check X-ray	
8.	Explains feeding protocol (clear water followed by escalating liquid feeds, aspiration every 4 hours to rule out gastric stasis))	
9.	Explains proper NG tube care (flush after every feed, sterile precautions while feeding, proper NG tube closure after feeds)


