Background

The appreciation and application of research principles is a core competency for medical students. Involvement in clinical research and audit is important for health professionals, both to ensure a high standard of healthcare and to develop an interest in research methodology. This project aims to demystify the auditing and clinical research process for medical students. It also provides a unique opportunity for self development, which will enrich medical students' clinical capabilities as doctors.

Aim:

> To promote the principles of evidence-based audit and research amongst our medical students.

The educational objectives:

Participation in this medical collaborative initiation is a novel medium for you engage to in academic projects. We sincerely believe that through participating in facilitated, supervised and focused study, you as students can gain significant improvements in confidence within a number of core academic domains.

The CReAMS would enable Student to

- Observe, interact with patient populace of the hospital
- Explore the social, economic links of healthcare delivery systems
- Practice communications and interview skills.
- Work as a team, in organizing, coordinating and facilitating each other's



efforts.

- Use data collection tools to elicit necessary information
- Perform simple statistical tools and do an analysis
- Present your findings to the Clinical Governance body of the Institute.
- Use Information technology to enhance learning and for research
- Improvements in professionalism and team working skills.
- Overcome previously reported barriers to engagement in extracurricular academic projects.
- Students who participate in such activities report significantly increased levels of confidence and appreciation of key academic principles.

The educational package developed to support this process will give specific attention to the necessary practical knowledge required by students, such as

- the socio-economic and clinical profile of the patients attending our Institute
 - working knowledge of the hospital departments \triangleright
- the facilities available & services offered patient care/workflow path ways
 - role of various healthcare professionals in patient care
- expectations of patients from the healthcare system esp. from doctors as a group and
- To identify the necessary data collection points required for conducting an audit and where to find these.
- More broadly, the novel "mini-team" peer support structure provides an on-going information sharing and encouragement



Benefits of getting involved in audits as a medical student

There are numerous individual advantages from getting involved in the clinical audit process as a medical student. These include:

- Students develop experience and learn the most efficient ways to do things. This will make working as a junior doctor much easier.
 - You increase your own understanding of clinical care, which help you in the long run.
 - You can develop an early commitment to a particular specialty.
 - Demonstrating such enthusiasm will impress faculty.
 - There will be opportunities to network with members of the healthcare team and senior clinicians.
 - You can present your findings at a national conference or publish them in a peer-reviewed journal.
 - Involvement in an audit might generate research ideas and lead to subsequent research projects.

The process

The whole project will be done in 4 phases:

Phase 1 – Orientation

Students shall receive orientation & hands on practice from a group of dedicated faculty on the following topics, amounting to (4*2.5=10 instruction hours)

- Clinical research & Audit
- > The process flow of CREAMS
- Conducting patient interviews & Data collection
- Data Entry & Use of excel spread sheets

The roles and responsibilities

This project would be done as a collaborative effort between the following departments – CReAMS team (a group of interested, self motivated and involved faculty members, Dept of Community Medicine & Quality Management services. The program is conceived and coordinated by Vice Principal (Curriculum).

Phase 2 - Data Collection & Capture

(i) This phase will last for 5 complete working days. During this time, the students will posed across various outpatient departments and service areas of the hospital for a cross sectional survey and data collection from the patients.

Each group shall collect data pertaining to the

- 1. Patient profile
- 2. Basic demographics
- 3. Disease profile
- Quality of care & services indices using a predefined Proforma
- (ii) All groups of students shall be posted in the wards on a single daywhere in a complete survey of all inpatients in the hospital shall be done on the above parameters.
- (iii) Part of the project involves facility and services mapping and study of the workflow patterns and processes in the hospital. To do so, each group of students shall be allotted a specific area to visit and processes to observe.
 - > The Students shall report to the allotted region, interact with the faculty & nursing team present in these regions and clarify their doubts. They shall then observe the workflow process hands-on.



- > The list of services and processes will be allotted to the groups will vary every day. A minimum of 3-5 workflow processes has to be observed by the students for better understanding.
- > The data collected by students shall be entered in validated excel spreadsheets for analysis.

Phase 3 - Data analysis & Presentation

The data collected and entered by students shall then be cleared & used to answer a few common research questions.

The Students shall then prepare

- > A report their findings to the research questions posted
- ➤ A power point presentation featuring to key questions of the research

These reports shall be complied & submitted for further analysis to the Quality Management team & Hospital authorities. A presentation shall made to be a full house of the Clinical Governance Body of the Institute consisting of Dean, MS, NS, QMS & all faculty.



Phase 4- Program Evaluation:

As a part of the program, you shall also be required to take part

- (i) Daily review feedback
- (ii) Focused group discussions
- (iii) Post test and
- (iv) You will be observed during the patient interviews.

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CReAMS (Clinical Research and Audit by Medical Students)

Background

The appreciation and application of research principles is a core competency for medical students. Involvement in clinical research and audit is important for health professionals, both to ensure a high standard of healthcare and to develop an interest in research methodology. This project aims to demystify the auditing and clinical research process for medical students. It also provides a unique opportunity for self development, which will enrich medical students' clinical capabilities as doctors.

Aim:

> To promote the principles of evidence-based audit and research amongst our medical students.

The educational objectives:

Participation in this medical collaborative initiation is a novel medium for you engage to in academic projects. We sincerely believe that through participating in facilitated, supervised and focused study, you as students can gain significant improvements in confidence within a number of core academic domains.

The CReAMS would enable Student to

- Observe, interact with patient populace of the hospital
- Explore the social, economic links of healthcare delivery systems
- Practice communications and interview skills.
- Work as a team, in organizing, coordinating and facilitating each other's



efforts.

- Use data collection tools to elicit necessary information
- Perform simple statistical tools and do an analysis
- Present your findings to the Clinical Governance body of the Institute.
- Use Information technology to enhance learning and for research
- Improvements in professionalism and team working skills.
- Overcome previously reported barriers to engagement in extracurricular academic projects.
- Students who participate in such activities report significantly increased levels of confidence and appreciation of key academic principles.

The educational package developed to support this process will give specific attention to the necessary practical knowledge required by students, such as

- the socio- economic and clinical profile of the patients attending our Institute
 - working knowledge of the hospital departments
- > the facilities available & services offered patient care/workflow path ways
 - role of various healthcare professionals in patient care
- expectations of patients from the healthcare system esp.
 from doctors as a group and
- > To identify the necessary data collection points required for conducting an audit and where to find these.
- More broadly, the novel "mini-team" peer support structure provides an on-going information sharing and encouragement



Benefits of getting involved in audits as a medical student

There are numerous individual advantages from getting involved in the clinical audit process as a medical student. These include:

- Students develop experience and learn the most efficient ways to do things. This will make working as a junior doctor much easier.
 - You increase your own understanding of clinical care, which help you in the long run.
 - You can develop an early commitment to a particular specialty.
 - Demonstrating such enthusiasm will impress faculty.
 - There will be opportunities to network with members of the healthcare team and senior clinicians.
 - You can present your findings at a national conference or publish them in a peer-reviewed journal.
 - Involvement in an audit might generate research ideas and lead to subsequent research projects.

The process

The whole project will be done in 4 phases:

Phase 1 - Orientation

Students shall receive orientation & hands on practice from a group of dedicated faculty on the following topics, amounting to (4*2.5=10 instruction hours)

- Clinical research & Audit

- Data Entry & Use of excel spread sheets





The roles and responsibilities

This project would be done as a collaborative effort between the following departments – CReAMS team (a group of interested, self motivated and involved faculty members, Dept of Community Medicine & Quality Management services. The program is conceived and coordinated by Vice Principal (Curriculum).

Phase 2 - Data Collection & Capture

(i) This phase will last for 5 complete working days. During this time, the students will posed across various outpatient departments and service areas of the hospital for a cross sectional survey and data collection from the patients.

Each group shall collect data pertaining to the

- 1. Patient profile
- 2. Basic demographics
- 3. Disease profile
- Quality of care & services indices using a predefined Proforma
- (ii) All groups of students shall be posted in the wards on a single daywhere in a complete survey of all inpatients in the hospital shall be done on the above parameters.
- (iii) Part of the project involves facility and services mapping and study of the workflow patterns and processes in the hospital. To do so, each group of students shall be allotted a specific area to visit and processes to observe.
 - > The Students shall report to the allotted region, interact with the faculty & nursing team present in these regions and clarify their doubts. They shall then observe the workflow process hands-on.



- > The list of services and processes will be allotted to the groups will vary every day. A minimum of 3-5 workflow processes has to be observed by the students for better understanding.
- The data collected by students shall be entered in validated excel spreadsheets for analysis.

Phase 3 - Data analysis & Presentation

The data collected and entered by students shall then be cleared & used to answer a few common research questions.

The Students shall then prepare

- > A report their findings to the research questions posted
- ➤ A power point presentation featuring to key questions of the research

These reports shall be complied & submitted for further analysis to the Quality Management team & Hospital authorities. A presentation shall made to be a full house of the Clinical Governance Body of the Institute consisting of Dean, MS, NS, QMS & all faculty.



Phase 4- Program Evaluation:

As a part of the program, you shall also be required to take part
