The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Prof. S.C. Parija called the 30th meet of the Board of Management to order. While welcoming the members of the Board of Management, he made pertinent remarks. The Vice Chancellor informed the Board that the valuable inputs, comments and suggestions enable SBV to plan as well as reorient its activities with particular focus on the realization of the deliverables within the stipulated period of time. Adding further, the Vice Chancellor expressed his heartfelt thanks to the nominees of the Hon'ble Chancellor as well as nominees of the Sponsoring Trust in the BoM for having taken special efforts to project SBV as a higher education institute of National and international standing. He then requested the External members on the Board to present their opening remarks.

Prof. Ved Prakash Mishra, recipient of the prestigious BC Roy award, expressed his happiness and proud privilege to be a part of the rich endeavours made by SBV within a short span of time. He further added that it has been quite an enriching experience to be on the Board, all aimed towards enhancing the visibility of SBV, besides serving for an erudite cause. Adding further, Prof. Mishra recorded his deep sense of gratitude to the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Prof. S.C. Parija for his exemplary leadership qualities. Prof. Mishra had a word of praise for the Office of the Registrar for the immaculate presentation of the agenda, minutes of the meeting and action taken report. He further remarked that at the meetings of the BoM of SBV, collective participation and consensus opinions and decisions signify participative democracy. Besides focused attention, commitment and valuable inputs provided at such meetings have considerably augmented the credibility of the endeavours and credentials of the University.

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Prof. Nitin M. Nagarkar in his opening remarks informed the Board that the learned experts drawn internally and externally have been making astute observations, clear directions and holistic commitments that have largely contributed, till date, to Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth. This has culminated in the fact that SBV has carved a niche in a short span of time, since its genesis.

Dr. S.R. Rao, Vice President, Research Innovation & Development, SBV and the Nominee of the Sponsoring trust informed the Board of Management that the developmental strategies at SBV have been quite impressive and hence it has been a pleasure contributing to the growth and development of SBV. As much as 30 crores have been earmarked for fostering research based activities in the recent years. The generous gesture of the Hon'ble Chancellor, Shri. M.K. Rajagopalan in granting a research fund of Rs. 2 crores INR aimed at COVID – 19 research deserves special mention. Under the dynamic leadership of Prof. S.C. Parija, an impressive surge in activities related to the Intellectual Property Rights has occurred that is vividly depicted in the Copyrights published, Patents published, Patents granted, Technology Transfer enabled and incubator established. The Bio-incubator that has been enabled at SBV would go a long way in effective utilization of genomic data which when combined with Artificial Intelligence and Big Data would significantly contribute towards diagnosis and management of diseases. Dr. Rao informed the Board that the Good laboratory practice facilities for conducting elegant experiments using animal model is almost nearing completion. For reasons largely attributed to COVID 19 pandemic, the proposed academic programmes in School of Biological Sciences of SBV could not get underway. However these programmes are to be launched with effect from the academic year 2021 onwards.

Dr. Rao informed the Board that National Accreditation Board for Testing and Calibration Laboratories (NABL) has accorded accreditation to the molecular diagnostic laboratories at the Main campus and Off campus. The Virology laboratory that is involved in COVID 19 testing has been approved by Indian Council for Medical Research (ICMR). Subsequent to that the Drug Controller of India and Directorate of Health & Family Welfare, Government of Puducherry have permitted Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Research Institute, a constituent college of Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth, for Phase III clinical trial of COVAXINE.

Dr. Krishna G. Seshadri, Nominee of the Sponsoring trust, expressed his happiness in involving himself with the all- round activities of SBV. Particularly after the advent of the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor and Vice president (RID), SBV has been making steady progress that has presently led SBV to stake its just claim in the Comity of Indian Universities. However Prof. Seshadri opined that the future directions that SBV has to take are considered crucial. He elaborated upon a few points that are considered cardinal in the larger interest of SBV in its pursuits towards academics, research and patient care.

• Effective Healthcare system can happen only when exceptional patient care is in place. A frequently ignored facet is the Quality paramedical staff. Taking cognizance of the fact that Allied Health Sciences and paramedical programmes are the feature in any reputed Health Science University, SBV should strive to augment work force in this direction.

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- Translational Research is the panacea for universal research in the millennium.
- Electronic Medical Records (EMR) is considered as an attribute towards patient care, patient safety, patient satisfaction besides fostering quality research. Hence SBV should look into this aspect and prepare nodal proposals based on EMR which holds a lot of promise, in addition to objectivizing our claims in patient care

Prof. Subhash Chandra Parija, Vice Chancellor and the Chairperson of the Board of Management, SBV asked the Registrar, SBV to present the agenda item wise. The Registrar tabled the agenda item wise and drew reference to the conduct of SBV Annual Convocation 2020 for the Faculty of Medicine to be held in the afternoon of 26th December 2020 and explained the agenda pertaining to the conduct of SBV Annual Convocation 2020 that was taken up for approval,

- This curriculum is old and outdated. The t/L methods are also the same and the assessment method tests only recall. Clinical skills are not tested in the " Clinical " exam, but there is scope for imparting skills and also assessing them in the internals. In the university the assessment is the same.
- Our institute has a team based inter disciplinary review team of curriculum coordinators who design the curriculum suitable to the students needs

- The institution is trying to innovative approaches. However, if the regulatory bodies and regional centers are going to be directive then the efforts would be wasted. It appears that the regulatory body is still in directive mode.
- More discussion should be made with respective department to improve the curriculum and teaching methods. Faculties should be trained by those who are expert in education field

- > Greater scope for enhancing the value of basic Biochemistry in the realms of clinical biochemistry

- Achievement of curricular aim is an uphill task. There are a number of road blocks, viz., students' knowledge of basic sciences, their attention and interest, and infrastructural bottlenecks. A majority of students fare below par in their knowledge of basic sciences related to ophthalmology; a quick pre-course, multiple choice-based assessment shall reveal this weakness. Incidentally, mismatch between students' efforts and pass percentage keep the students unaware of realities. Poor attention of students in the class, to large extent due to mobile phones in the class, remain another barrier in teaching-learning. Clinical postings face another set of problems. Large student groups (50-60) in clinical posting fail to allow the teachers to take advantage of small group teaching. Also, a class room for twenty-five students scarcely accommodates fifty to sixty students.
- With 250 students per batch, student -teacher ratio, although it confirms to MCI mandate, does not suffice for the needs of competency-based education. Assessment of competencies enumerated in the new curriculum shall prove a challenging task keeping in mind the diverse responsibilities of teachers.
- > Scope for curricular innovations exists in the institution.
- Steps taken to improve and innovate curriculum is a great initiative. PG's and junior faculties who have recently passed out must be included in the group.
- Institute is sincerely committed to curricular innovations & has experienced Sr. Faculty for guidance.

- Introduced skill lab training for routes of drug administration, demonstrates animal simulation using CAL software, communication skills is taught
- The present curriculum can be improved by making teaching and learning more practical. Students have a very theoretical knowledge and most of the times do not understand what they have learnt from the curriculum. Example based teaching has to be taught for better learning.
- I will respond from the perspective of a community medicine faculty. The incorporation of OSCE is a good strategy to evaluate the clinical skills of the students. The standardized patient history taking sessions is a great learning experience for the students before they venture into the clinical side and deal with the real patients. I feel that the HEART program is not necessary for the curriculum and can be stopped. The CDFIT program has sufficient community interaction and with a little tweaking, it can be perfected. It will be better if students are made to present seminars instead of having class tests as a mode of mid semester evaluation.

So i kindly request the curriculum committee to take consensus from all stakeholders, including the junior most faculty which will improve the outcome.
- The present curriculum has early clinical exposure which helps students to correlate basic sciences with clinical cases. The steps curriculum provided horizontal and vertical integration
- Will benefit both the student and the teacher if implemented properly.
- If permitted try implementing programmatic assessment in making high and low stake decisions.
